

VIRTUAL TOUR: CONVICT TIMES – NSW STATE CURRICULUM LINKS

This excursion is suitable for students in Kindergarten as well as Years 1 to 4. It aligns with the History Syllabus in stages 1 and 2 and also has particular relevance to the suggested Stage 2 HSIE unit of work 'British Colonisation'.

HSIE	Stage 2	CCS2.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Sequences significant events related to human occupation in Australia. ➤ Explains the roles played by significant people during the British colonisation of Australia as a penal colony. ➤ Describes some of the consequences of British invasion for Aboriginal peoples. ➤ Describes aspects of ways of life and achievements in the early colony for male and female convicts and ex-convicts, the military and their families, officials and officers, Aboriginal people, free settlers. ➤ Refers to different viewpoints and perspectives on a significant historical event. ➤ Explains why terms such as 'invasion', 'occupation', 'settlement', 'exploration' and 'discovery' reflect different perspectives on the same event. ➤ Acquires and critically evaluates information from source material.
