

## **VIRTUAL TOUR: CONVICT TIMES – NSW STATE CURRICULUM LINKS**

This excursion is suitable for students in Kindergarten as well as Years 1 to 4. It aligns with the History Syllabus in stages 1 and 2 and also has particular relevance to the suggested Stage 2 HSIE unit of work 'British Colonisation'.

HSIE	Stage 2	CCS2.1	<ul> <li>Sequences significant events related to human occupation in Australia.</li> <li>Explains the roles played by significant people during the British colonisation of Australia as a penal colony.</li> <li>Describes some of the consequences of British invasion for Aboriginal peoples.</li> <li>Describes aspects of ways of life and achievements in the early colony for male and female convicts and exconvicts, the military and their families, officials and officers, Aboriginal people, free settlers.</li> <li>Refers to different viewpoints and perspectives on a significant historical event.</li> <li>Explains why terms such as 'invasion', 'occupation', 'settlement', 'exploration' and 'discovery' reflect different perspectives on the same event.</li> <li>Acquires and critically evaluates information from source material.</li> </ul>

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
