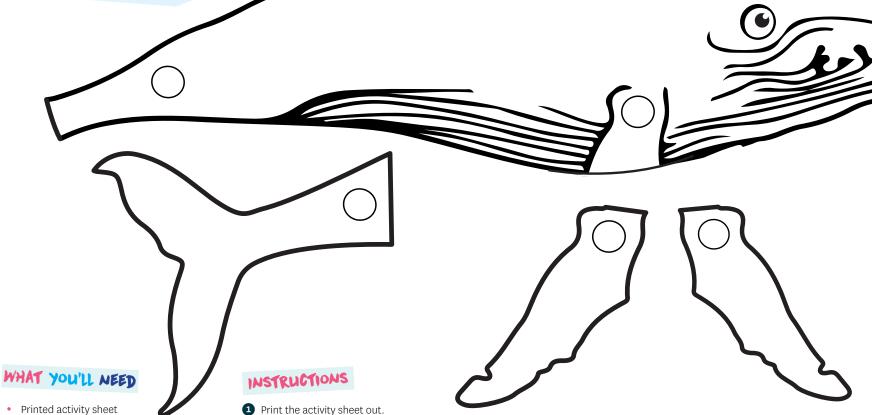

Create a humpback whale puppet

JUST FOR FUN



- Printed activity sheet
- Pencils or markers
- Scissors
- Brass fasteners
- Paddle pop stick
- Sticky tape

- 2 Colour in the whale body, fins and the tail.
- 3 Cut out all the pieces.
- 4 Take the two fins and line the holes on the fins with the hole on the whale body so that the coloured sides are facing forward. Secure front to back with a brass fastener.
- 5 Secure the tail to the body by lining up the holes and securing with a brass fastener from front to back.
- 6 To make a puppet, stick a paddle pop stick to the middle of the whale on the back side.

PID YOU KNOW?

Each year, between May and October, humpback whales migrate from the cold waters of the Antarctic to the east coast of Australia. They undertake this journey to breed in the tropical waters south of the equator. If you visit North Head Sanctuary on a calm day, you might be able to look out to the ocean and watch them on their travels.
