As one of Australia's most historically and culturally significant sites, Cockatoo Island offers the perfect destination for your school group.

The island's history starts with its First Nations use and encompasses many of the major landmarks of colonial and post-colonial Australian history. Its structures and relics tell the stories of convicts and orphans, of workers and wars, offering a unique opportunity for your students to interact with living history through our engaging primary and secondary programs. As a UNESCO World Heritage site, Cockatoo Island presents a unique opportunity for students to engage with living history – and have fun – while still being in the heart of Australia's largest city.

Our campground makes the learning experience even more fun. Cockatoo Island has all the amenities your school group needs — including hot showers, a large camp kitchen, ten BBQs, fridges, microwaves and access to boiling water. Plus, groups can arrange catering through the island's family-friendly cafes.

PLAN YOUR TRIP

CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT

Check-in is from 2pm and check-out is by 10am. If your group arrives ahead of check-in or wishes to remain on the island after check-out, you can arrange to store your baggage in the buggy shelter located outside the Visitor Centre.

HOW TO GET HERE

The easiest way to get to Cockatoo Island is by public ferry. The F3 and F8 services operate to Cockatoo Island daily, departing from Circular Quay, Darling Harbour and Barangaroo as well as from wharves along Parramatta River. For further information, including timetables, visit the Transport NSW website.

• If your group is travelling to Cockatoo Island by ferry, each person will need to be in possession of an Opal, debit or credit card with sufficient funds.

• If you are catching a ferry to Cockatoo Island with a large group, we encourage you to notify Transdev Sydney Ferries via their contact form at transdev.com.au/contact-us. Please ensure they are made aware of the size of your group, the ferry service you intend to use (e.g. F3 Parramatta Service at 10am on 17 July) and where you are travelling to and from (e.g. Circular Quay to Cockatoo Island).

NEARBY PARKING

• On-street parking is available for cars near the ferry wharves at Woolwich, Greenwich, Chiswick,

Huntleys Point, Drummoyne, Birchgrove and Balmain.

• The Harbour Trust has a car park at the Hunters Hill Sailing Club (accessible via Clarke Road, Woolwich). The car park can accommodate a coach and is a short walk from the Woolwich ferry

wharf. Email education@harbourtrust.gov.au to arrange parking.

BARGING

Groups may wish to barge a vehicle to the island in the event they have lots of equipment, food or other supplies. Barging can be arranged through the Cockatoo Island Marine Centre (PH: 0424 042 833). The vehicle operators must also review, complete and sign the Harbour Trust's driver induction form prior to the trip.

SAFETY AND ACCESSIBILITY

Cockatoo Island is a former industrial site with cliffs and steep drops as well as occasional unmarked and uneven surfaces, voids and trip hazards. For your safety (and that of your students), mind your step, wear appropriate enclosed footwear, stay alert for vehicles and monitor your group.

The lower island is generally accessible by wheelchairs and mobility scooters; however, there are uneven surfaces and some buildings are not suited to mobility aids. Accessing the upper island requires visitors to climb stairs or ascend steep rises. Due to the heritage nature of buildings, some buildings on the upper island are only accessible via stairs. The campground is wheelchair accessible, with a dedicated shower and toilet available; however, tents have a step to enter, which is not suitable for wheelchair access.

Priority works and major events may disrupt visitor access to areas of Cockatoo Island. Check our website for details and speak to our Visitor Centre staff for help, including alternative routes. Assistance animals (as defined by the Disability Discrimination Act 1992) are permitted on Cockatoo Island.

Submission of this form does not constitute a confirmed booking. Our accommodation team will first need to check the availability for your requested dates. They will then contact you to finalise details. This may include arranging alternative dates if those requested aren't available. Once your group's requirements have been confirmed, we will email you an invoice together with an information kit.

SCHOOL GROUP EXPERIENCES

You can organise a range of great school group experiences during your stay. Activities include curriculum-based education programs (\$14 per student, teachers/supervisors free) and the after-hours Dark Past Tour (\$14 per student, teachers/supervisors free). Note: Programs and tours must be arranged through the Harbour Trust's education team. Due to demand, it is recommended you book at least 2 months in advance. Learn more and request a program: **cockatooisland.gov.au/education-programs** Meanwhile, films screen at set times in the campground cinema each night and screenings can be attended free of charge. However, group cinematic experiences can be arranged through the accommodation team at a cost of \$8 per person (includes popcorn). Note: The cinema has a capacity of 30 people. Further, marshmallows can be purchased (\$7 per bag) for toasting around the campfire (weather dependent)
